HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT PARKING PASS APPLICATION

Va. Code § 22.1-205.1: Each public high school shall require any student who applies to obtain a pass to park a vehicle on school property to provide evidence that the student possesses a valid driver's license or driver privilege card. The Department of Education shall develop, and each public high school shall utilize, a standard application form for students to use to obtain a pass to park a vehicle on school property.

Teen Driving Restrictions

Virginia's driving restrictions are not meant to penalize teen drivers, but to help them stay safe while they gain valuable driving experience. Studies have found that these restrictions work to reduce the number of car crashes among young drivers.

Curfew Restrictions

If you are under age 18, Virginia law prohibits you from driving between midnight and 4 A.M. except when driving:

- to or from a place of business where you are employed;
- to or from an activity that is supervised by an adult and is sponsored by a school or by a civic, religious, or public organization;
- with a licensed spouse age 18 or older, parent or other adult acting in loco parentis who is occupying the front passenger seat,
- in case of an emergency, including responding to emergency calls as a volunteer firefighter or rescue squad personnel.

Restrictions on the Number of Passengers

If you are under age 18, you may carry only one passenger under age 21, unless accompanied by a licensed parent, or other adult acting in place of a parent, in the front passenger seat. However, after you have held your license for one year, you may carry up to three passengers under age 21 in the following situations:

- Travel to and from a school-sponsored activity;
- A licensed driver 21 or older is in the front passenger seat; or
- · In case of an emergency.

Learner's permit holders may not carry more than one passenger under age 18. (Passenger restrictions do not apply to family members)

Cellular Telephone Restrictions

§ 46.2–818.2. Virginia's cellular telephone law prohibits any person from holding a handheld personal communications device while driving a moving motor vehicle on the highways in the Commonwealth.

New Kent High School Rules & Procedures 2023-2024

Students are permitted to park on school premises as a matter of privilege, not of right. A parking tag will be assigned from New Kent High School for the 2023-2024 school year. The current parking tag must be hung on the rearview mirror of the vehicle with the assigned number (#) facing outward. If a different vehicle will be driven, a copy of the registration for the current vehicle needs to be provided and the assigned tag moved to the other vehicle.

- Students are responsible for the contents in their vehicles and may not possess weapons, alcohol, drugs, or any other illegal substances/items on school grounds.
- I understand the school retains authority to conduct routine patrols of student parking lots and inspections of the exteriors of student automobiles on school property. The interiors of student vehicles may be inspected whenever a school official has reasonable suspicion to believe that the student has violated, or is about to violate, the law, or a school rule, and that the search will yield evidence of the violation; or, that illegal or unauthorized materials, or other evidence of illegal or otherwise prohibited unauthorized materials, are contained inside the automobile. Such patrols and inspections may be conducted without notice, without student or guardian consent, and without a search warrant.
- The vehicle must be operated safely at all times. Seat belts must be worn at all times on school property per state law.
- The vehicle must be parked in the assigned spot ONLY. Vehicles without parking tags and/or students who do not have administrative approval to park on school grounds will have their vehicle towed at the owner's expense.
- All student drivers and riders are expected to exit the vehicles upon arrival to school grounds and enter the building immediately after parking. Loitering in the parking lot is not allowed and is subject to disciplinary action. Any student out of place = 1st violation, driving privileges will be lost for 2 weeks, and 2nd violation will result in loss of driving privileges for the semester.
- Any student assigned LATE ARRIVAL or EARLY RELEASE on their schedule is required to park in the front entrance parking lot regardless of grade level. There will be no exceptions.
- Students are to bring in all materials that will be needed during the school day. No student will be allowed to go to their vehicle at any time during the school day. If a student does not comply, this will result in immediate termination of the driving/parking contract and/or short/long term suspension of driving privileges.
- Students must have written permission and/or administrative approval to leave school grounds at any time other than normal dismissal time. This policy applies to all students, including students 18 years of age or older, and/or who may be legally emancipated.
- Student drivers and their parents/guardians are responsible for the passengers and their belongings within their vehicle.
- The school administration may nullify this contract and revoke a student's driving privilege as a general response to any disciplinary category, including excessive tardiness to school.

New Kent High School Tardy Policy

Tardy 1 & Tardy 2	Verbal warnings from educator noted in PowerSchool as UT = unexcused tardy
Tardy 3	After-school detention Tuesday or Thursday until 4:45PM; may use activity bus home
Tardy 4	Verbal warning from educator of upcoming day of in-school suspension (ISS) issued at tardy 5
Tardy 5	Administrative referral 1 day of in-school suspension (ISS) issued
Tardy 6 & beyond	Administrative referral: Individual student and guardian conference Consequence issued following conference by school administrator

A parent/guardian must provide an explanation for the tardiness on the same date of the occurrence. Otherwise, the tardiness will remain as UT (unexcused tardy) regardless of the reason.
